

Author Guide for Citation

In Text Body:

- References include every source from which the author obtained information, images, or data of any kind. These must be referred to in the body of the research in one of the following ways at the end of the quoted paragraph or sentence:
 - o (Parker 2009) or (Parker 2009 p. 43) in foreign texts.
- The International Design Journal **does not use the footnote method** to refer to references, but rather all references used are referred to once at the end of the research.
- The following models include how to refer to references at the end of the research in APA style, but the researcher can adhere to any standard method for citation such as (APA, MLA, Harvard, Michigan, or Vancouver) and includes the following types of citations
 - [1] Quoting from a scientific journal
 - [2] Quoting from a paper published in a conference
 - [3] Quoting from pages of a book
 - [4] A foreign language scientific journal
- This list should include works cited in the text of the research and should be published or accepted for publication. Unpublished works are referred to as Unpublished.
- References can be arranged either according to their appearance in the research or alphabetically.

The references list (at the end of the research)

To write a reference taken from one of the articles published in the International Design Journal, the journal provides two methods:

First: **From the footer of the research itself**. By opening the published research file in PDF format and then copying the citation found at the footer of the individual pages of the research.
